At one of the camp services, God spoke to me to step out of my comfort zone to share His goodness and love. I frequently interact with patients in my course of work, many of whom are down and depressed, but I did not have the boldness to share with them about God. Before camp, I had a patient who was struggling with a serious complication. Unknowing to him, I prayed softly beside his bed and God immediately resolved the complication before my very eyes without me having to do anything. However, I did not have the courage to reveal to the patient that I had prayed for him. **After hearing about stepping out of my comfort zone during the camp, I decided to take a step of faith to share with him how I had prayed for his miracle.** He then revealed to me that he was a Christian who has not been attending church for a long time because of his medical condition. I proceeded to encourage him and urged him to trust God for complete healing. Since our conversation, **I saw him being filled with hope, and he has come out of his depressed state.** He progressively became better with physiotherapy and took the initiative to move his limbs more on his bed. I thank God for healing this patient and for using me to bring hope and life to him. **In stepping out of my comfort zone, I have overcome my fear of speaking to my patients about God, thereby experiencing a breakthrough in my life!**
